


Tips, Reminders & Etiquette

Clark Hall/Administration (AD)

First Floor (1 of 2)

- Access Office: Our disability support service. Students may seek out the Access Office if they have a documented disability, IEP, or 504 plan, or need assistance with things such as test anxiety.
- Student Advocacy and Resource Center (SARC): Any St. Louis
 Community College student may seek services from SARC. Services could include assistance with navigating government assistance programs, help with food insecurity, finding childcare, and finding housing.
- Recruitment & Outreach: This is our department! We assist with tours and completing the application. We also help students figure out why STLCC is a good fit for them.

Clark Hall/Administration (AD)

Second Floor

- Academic Advising: Student Success Advisors are available to assist students with program clarification, course selection, transfer information, including information about CORE 42, and understanding academic policy and procedure.
- Counselors: Licensed mental health counselors are available to assist you with personal and crisis counseling and/or suicide prevention resources. This is a free resource for current students.

Clark Hall/Administration (AD)

First Floor (2 of 2)

- Enrollment Services: To begin the college application process, you'll need to register for classes, apply for graduation and conduct other business related to student records. They also can help with any financial aid or loan questions. This is where your FAFSA (Free application for federal student aid) and additional paperwork will be delivered.
- U-Pass: You may also pick up your FREE Metro U-Pass in the Cashier's Office as long as you are enrolled as a credit student (taking at least 1 credit hour). The U-Pass is unlimited and can be used on the MetroBus and MetroLink.

Physical Education (PE)

- Our **gym and weight room** are all located in this building.
- The weight room is open from 11:30 am 4 pm on Mon, Tues, and Wed. The gym is open to students when not in use by sports teams.

STLCC Transformed

- Business Administration (BA), Communications South (CS), and the Library (L) are getting demolished in STLCC Transformed so just describe.
- BA had accounting, economics, business, political science, and history classes. Most classes have been moved to the science buildings or Communications North.
- CS had communications and foreign language classes including French, German, and Spanish. Most classes have been relocated to Communications North.

Science South (SS) (Section 1)

- Be sure to mention the different science classes we offer. Some of the science classes offered on the campus are:
 - Biology
 - Chemistry

- Most of our science classes, including the ones listed above, will follow the GSTS transfer pathway.

Lecture Halls (LH) (Section 2)

- There are four **lecture halls** located in this building.
- While our average class size is 23, we do have lecture halls that can host around 80 students. Our classes are much smaller than many universities in the area.
- Let students know they can usually take classes in smaller sizes if they would like, and recommend applying early to have more time and availability options.
- Show the students one of the open lecture halls (if not in use).
- Classes such as history, psychology, biology, political science, and sociology that are taken by many majors are hosted in lecture hall size classes.

Science West (SW) (Section 3)

- Allow students to get excited about the snakes and snapping turtle on display. Feel free to give our turtle a new name on every tour!
- Talk about all of the science artifacts you pass by. We have geology, horticulture, and physical science in this section. Our nursing program is also located in this section.
- Horticulture is a huge part of our campus; it is a unique program at Meramec. This is where you can mention that we have four main campuses
- Our **math** and **engineering** departments are upstairs. Many math and engineering classes are held in this section.
- We have horticulture and nursing associate programs. The other programs listed above follow our GSTS pathway.

Student Center (SC)

First Floor (Library and Bookstore)

- The Reference Librarians are available to help students with internet and database research. Students can also utilize our free printing here!
- Students are free to use any of the **computers** in the library as long as they are open and the content is appropriate, and **laptops** are available to check out while in the library.
- Step into the lobby and point out the bookstore which is next to
 the elevator. Students can rent books or buy them new, used, or in
 an e-book format. We offer a price match guarantee, and students
 can have their textbooks shipped to their homes or the bookstore.
 Also, students can sell their books on our marketplace after classes end.
- We often sell school supplies in this area.

Campus Police/Student Center Quad

- As you're cutting through the Student Center Quad, mention all of the events that occur here during the semester (i.e. food trucks, club celebrations). It's a huge selling point!
- Also, talk about the police department here. The primary purpose of our professionally trained College Police Department is to create a secure and safe environment for the college community.
- The campus police can assist students with lockouts, jump-starts, and can provide safety escorts to their vehicles upon request. The Police Department personnel are on duty 24 hours a day 7 days a week, including holidays.
- Students will automatically be signed up for campus alerts. These notify students about emergencies, closings, safety drills, and more.

Student Center (SC)

Second Floor (1 of 2)

- Upstairs is our Campus Life office where students get their Student ID and Parking Pass - both of which are free the first time. Parking at STLCC is completely free.
- Campus Life also works with students to get involved! We have many clubs such as The Music Club, Board Game Club, Engineering Club, and more! Students can also go to Campus Life and start their own clubs!

Student Center (SC)

Second Floor (2 of 2)

- Mention that the Montage Student Newspaper is located upstairs, especially if anyone is planning to major in journalism.
- TRIO Office: You are eligible to join TRIO if you qualify for the Pell
 Grant, if you are a first-generation college student, or if you have a
 documented disability. TRIO offers academic support services to
 students such as tutoring, one-on-one advising, personal assistance,
 and college survival workshops.
- While many of our degrees involving computers are at other campuses, we do have some computer lab classes upstairs.

- FYI, free Wi-Fi is available throughout campus, including parking lots.

Humanities West (HW)

- The Meramec Theater Department offers five student-run productions throughout the year. This is particularly good for students interested in set or costume design or being a makeup artist. If the theater is open, it's great to show. All productions are free of charge for attendees
- Mention that most of the artwork in the Humanities building is student made, usually from the current semester.
- There is a music and choir room located directly across from the Theater.

Humanities East (HE)

Humanities East (HE)

- The music department is located under the stairs.
- Drawing, painting and photography classes are all located on the second floor. Stop at the stairs and point up or show area if students are interested.
- Continue down the hall and tell students the art lockers are available for art students to use.
- Graphic design classrooms are located just past the art lockers, along with the ceramics and sculpture studio. Also mention the Art Gallery.
- Most of our arts classes are part of the GFA transfer pathway. We do have photography and graphic communications associate programs, however.

Communications North Building (CN)

- Point out the English Department.
- The Testing Center is in room CN122. The Accuplacer placement test and ESL (English as a Second Language) tests are given here.
 Also, students who need assistance through the Access Office can also take their tests in this office.
- Early college's department is down towards Clark Hall.
- This is one of the main classroom flex spaces for STLCC Transformed.
- Another Math Lab is located next to the doors in front of Clark Hall.
 They offer tutoring, as well as classes in this lab. Many math classes are in CN.
